From December 30, 2024, all relevant commodities and products must:

- + Be deforestation-free: No deforestation or forest degradation post-December 31, 2020.
- + Comply with local laws: Adherence to environmental, labor, and human rights laws.
- + Have a due diligence statement: Detailed compliance and risk assessment documentation.

FAILURE TO COMPLY CAN RESULT IN:

- +Fines up to 4% of the company's EU revenue.
- +Confiscation of products and income.
- +Being listed as a non-compliant company.

UNDERSTANDING EUDR: KEY FACTS AND MISCONCEPTIONS

KEY FACTS ABOUT EUDR

- 1. Wide Range of Products Covered
 - + Applies to cattle, cocoa, coffee, palm oil, rubber, soy, wood, and derived products.
- 2. Compliance Deadline
 - + Enforcement begins on December 30, 2024, with extended deadlines for small businesses.
- 3. Legal and Environmental Requirements
 - + Products must not be sourced from land deforested after December 31, 2020.
 - + Must comply with the legal framework of the production country.



COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS

Misconception 1: Compliance Timeline

• Reality: Companies must comply by January 1, 2025, with an 18-month transition period starting June 2023.

Misconception 2: Deforestation Definition

• Reality: Any forest clearing for agriculture is considered deforestation.

Misconception 3: Land Titles

• Reality: Farmers need land titles only if required by national laws. Accurate geolocation data is essential.

Misconception 4: Certification

• Reality: No existing certifications automatically ensure compliance, though they can aid in due diligence.

Misconception 5: Impact on Smallholders

• Reality: The regulation poses challenges but also offers market opportunities for fairer prices.
